During an illustrious career that spanned over 25 years Oscar Rodriguez was considered the “Voice of College Park”.

“Oscar was simply irreplaceable” according to long time Coach and Hall of Famer Bill Kepler, “his style and voice were so unique, a true professional”.

He could be heard at all CP home games for football, basketball, volleyball and playoff baseball and alumni games. Rodriguez worked both girls and boys games, unheard of in that era.

Oscar had his handprint on most things purple, booster club president, bingo caller, Grand Marshall, North Coast Section announcer for play-offs, as well as a community sports activist with little league and youth football.

Rodriguez’s contributions to the legacy of College Park athletics wasn’t limited to an unforgettable broadcasting career but he and wife Virginia “donated” four sons to the Falcon sports scene, all of whom played and excelled in multiple sports for their alma mater.

While his career was punctuated with individual successes and team championships, his favorite calls were of the 1993 undefeated football season and the 1996 girls winning the North Coast Section Championship game at St Mary’s College.

Mr. Oscar Rodriguez, for all that you have done for your beloved College Park Falcons, the community and sports in general, thanks for the memories and welcome to the CPHS Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2015.
