

Fourteen out of the fifteen varsity wresters were part of a very successful club program centered around Valley View Middle School and the Pleasant Hill Wrestling Club. A majority of the team had developed friendships dating back to elementary school and the chemistry/camaraderie was phenomenal. I never had a problem with the parents or wrestlers and they were always supportive of the coaching staff and the program.

This team accumulated 16 North Coast medals individually, nine of these guys went on to the finals of NCS over their tenure, with eight champions. Those not making the finals, went on to earn six more medals. The team won League, took third in North Coast and finished fourth in the California High School State Wrestling Championships. Casey Strand would make it to the finals for a second straight year, winning his first state title and Elvin Seidenspinner made his name known after taking fourth as a sophomore.
